



Peace, Quiet & Tranquility on Scotland's Only Lake and an Outdoor Adventure:

Visit Callander's bakeries, deli or sandwich shops and pack yourself a bespoke picnic before setting out for this memorable day. The choice is yours, choose either a morning of adventure and a relaxing afternoon or the other way around. Both are located within a few miles of each other and just a short 20 minute drive from Callander. Prior reservations are essential for all activities at Castle Rednock – please call 01877 385276.

Please note: The first outward sailing on Lake of Menteith is 10am and the last outward sailing is 16.15 from 25th March until 30th September (15.15 throughout the winter), however please also be aware that the last return sailing in summer is around 16.30 .

Follow the A81 from Callander to the junction with the A873, turn right following signs for A81 Glasgow to Castle Rednock or on to Port of Menteith.

Lake of Menteith and Inchmahome Priory:

Take the A81 to Port of Menteith, turn left on to the B8034 for a short distance and follow the sign to Inchmahome Priory. It is estimated that there are 31,460 freshwater lochs (including lochans) in Scotland but this is Scotland's only "Lake". The little boat operates on a shuttle system, if no one is already waiting on the jetty turn the board so that the white side faces the island to beckon the boat. Enjoy a short sail on the beautiful Lake of Menteith to the peaceful little island of Inchmahome. Visit Inchmahome Priory, a 13th century ruined priory possibly most famous for providing a safe haven for Mary Queen of Scots when she was just 4 years old. Enjoy the tranquillity of nature as you stroll through the woodlands on the island. It is quite special in early June when the woodlands are carpeted with wild bluebells. Choose a secluded picnic spot and relax and enjoy a leisurely picnic before you sail back to the shore.





Castle Rednock Outdoor Activities:

Castle Rednock is immediately on your right just after you turn right at the junction with the A873. Castle Rednock Trekking Centre offer a choice of outdoor activities including pony trekking, Segway trekking, Shetland Driving, Wellie Boot Orienteering Course and Quad Pods for young children.

Pony Trekking: You can enjoy the beautiful scenery from horseback on a supervised pony trek. Treks are 1-2 hours long and cover some of the most scenic locations within the Loch Lomond and Trossachs National Park. Riding hats are provided and fitted by experienced staff. Castle Rednock caters for all ability levels and ages from 4 years and above. An upper weight limit of 17 stones/108kg applies.

Segway Trekking is an exciting new experience on intriguing, environmentally friendly machines. After a short training session enjoy gliding along scenic tracks on a guided tour. Please note that there is a minimum age restriction of 10 years and an upper weight restriction of 17 stones /108kg.

Enjoy a challenge on Castle Rednock's orienteering course, or try out the new Wellie Boot course

Quad Pods are great fun for young children aged 3 years and over and allow young children to enjoy a scenic farm trip from the safe seat of a quad pod. Alternatively try your hand at Shetland Pony driving, Castle Rednock's experienced staff and willing little Shetland Pony will help you develop new skills in carriage driving.
