



## The Bonnie Banks of Loch Lomond, quirky Tea Room & Weather Stone and a Forest Adventure

Note: It is possible to spend an entire day at both Inversnaid and The Forest Lodge Visitor Centre. We have combined the 2 activities to offer you a varied day, however we recommend you spend a full day at Inversnaid and a full day at the Forest Lodge Visitor Centre if you want to relax and truly enjoy each experience to the full.

### Loch Lomond Cruise:

Please allow at least 1 ½ hours to get to Inversnaid, please also ensure you have plenty fuel before leaving Callander, there are no fuel stations in Inversnaid

Escape the crowds of the south shores of Loch Lomond and admire the “Bonnie Banks” on a sail from Inversnaid at the fjord like north east end of Loch Lomond. Cruises leave Inversnaid daily at 10.30, 12.00 & 14.15, the trip will allow you some time ashore to explore Tarbet on the west side of Loch Lomond.



Take the A84 north from Callander for just under 1 mile and turn left on to the A821 sign posted Aberfoyle and The Trossachs Trail. This winding route is one on “Britain’s Best Drives” and offers stunning views over three shimmering lochs, Loch

Venachar, Loch Achray and Loch Drunkie. Just after you arrive in Aberfoyle turn right at the junction and follow the B829 through Kinlochard and on to Inversnaid passing the beautiful Loch Ard, Loch Chon and Loch Arklet on the way.

After your cruise take time to admire the waterfalls at Inversnaid. The West Highland Way (one of Scotland's Great Trails) passes through Inversnaid – keen walkers will enjoy following the trail north or south along the east side of Loch Lomond.



Return to Aberfoyle by the same route. A short detour to Stronachlachar on Loch Katrine is highly recommended, the Pier Tea Room is lovely or a stop at the quirky “Wee Blether Tea Room” in Kinlochard is highly recommended, don't forget to check out the “Wee Blether's” famous “Weather Stone”, renowned for its accuracy!

#### The Lodge Forest Visitor Centre:

Return to Aberfoyle and turn left on to the A821, then look out for a right turn in to The Lodge Forest Visitor Centre and begin your forest adventure. If you like to live life adventurously The Go Ape High Wire Adventure is for you, with the UK's longest zip wire, tarzan swings and rope ladders. For the less adventurous there are lovely forest walks, especially the Waterfall Walk, where you can relax in the nature hide and enjoy viewing red squirrels and wild birds feeding.

Return to Callander following the A821 and enjoying different vistas on your way back as the road climbs up the Duke's Pass. Turn right at the end of the A821 and join the A84 back into Callander.
