



## The Trossachs Trail and Sail on the Steamship Sir Walter Scott:

Callander is the gateway to the stunning scenery of the Trossachs – drive through this area of outstanding natural beauty and experience the true spirit of Scotland – misty mountains, tranquil glens, shimmering lochs, rivers, waterfalls, forests and quaint little villages. There is so much to see and do along the Trossachs Trail you may wish to spend several days of your holiday in the Trossachs. This beautiful scenery created by the Highland Boundary Fault is a walker's paradise – with many wonderful walks to suit all abilities and enough to keep keen walkers going for a week. This Great Day Out follows just part of one of “Britain's Best Drives” to follow the entire Trossachs trail please see Destination Callander's Scenic Drives.

Follow the A84 from Callander for approximately 1 mile to Kilmahog and take a left turn on to the A821 signposted Aberfoyle and The Trossachs Trail. Enjoy the beautiful views over Loch Venachar and Loch Achray as you follow the road through the tiny village of Brig o' Turk towards Loch Katrine. Just after Loch Achray the road bends sharply to the left, take the road on the right and follow the narrow road for a short distance to Loch Katrine. The magnificent landscape of Loch Katrine unfolds in front on you, a place where time seems to stand still, steeped in history and legend.



The world famous Steamship Sir Walter Scott has been taking visitors for a sail back in time on the beautiful Loch Katrine for 115 years. This trip is a “must do” for any visitor to the Trossachs and is the permanent Number 1 on Destination Callander’s “Trossachs Top Ten”. There are a variety of cruises to choose from – Note:advance reservations are recommended. Keen walkers and cyclists may enjoy the 10.30 morning cruise to Stronachlachar then walk or cycle back the 13 miles to The Trossachs Pier. Cycle hire is available at the Trossachs Pier. Take time after your cruise to relax and enjoy a gentle stroll along the shores of Loch Katrine watching the steamship

Return to Callander via the same route, we can highly recommend a stop at the quaint little Brig o’ Turk Tea Room, made famous in the 1959 version of the film “The 39 Steps”. Take a walk through the tiny village of Brig o’ Turk and see if you can spot the “Bicycle Tree”. Alternatively extend your trip and turn right as you exit from Loch Katrine on to the A821 and follow our Trossachs Trail scenic drive.
