



Loch Earn

A lovely drive offering stunning views from the south shores of Loch Earn and a choice of 2 routes back to Callander.

- ❑ Take the A84 north west out of Callander.
- ❑ If you haven't already seen Highland cattle grazing in the fields, stop at the Trossach's Woollen Mill (on your right) and meet Hamish the Highland bull, he's very photogenic.
- ❑ Continue along the A84, passing Loch Lubnaig on your left – do stop at the lochshore car park on your left, as the reflections in the water on a calm day are wonderful.
- ❑ Rejoin the A84, drive through Strathyre and on to Lochearnhead.
- ❑ Just before you reach Lochearnhead, take the unclassified road on your right.
- ❑ Continue on this unclassified road as it winds along the south shores of Loch Earn – the views are quite stunning.
- ❑ This road rejoins the A85 at St Fillans – you now have a choice of return routes.

Return via North Loch Earn

- ❑ Turn left on to the A85 at St Fillans, and follow the A85 back to Lochearnhead following the road along the north banks of Loch Earn.
- ❑ Drive through Lochearnhead and at the T-junction turn left on to the A84.
- ❑ Return to Callander on the A84 – approximately 13 miles.
- ❑ If you are ready for lunch the Lade Inn at Kilmahog (just off to your right on the A821) serves excellent bar food and produce their own beers: Way Lade, Lade Back and Lade Out!!

Return via Comrie

- ❑ Turn right at St Fillans on to the A85 and continue on to Comrie.
- ❑ If you are ready for lunch we can highly recommend The Royal Hotel in Comrie.
- ❑ Turn right on to the B827 to Braco.
- ❑ At Braco follow the B8033, through Kinbuck and on to Dunblane.
- ❑ From Dunblane, take the A820 to Doune.
- ❑ At Doune turn right on to the A84 to return to Callander.
